ORDER

UPON considering paragraph 3(i) of the Order of the Chairman made on 1 May 2014 (the "Directions Order"), which requires the Respondent to file and serve by 5pm on 18 July 2014 its skeleton argument

AND UPON considering paragraph 3(j) of the Directions Order, which requires Booking.com B.V., Expedia, Inc., and InterContinental Hotels Group Plc to file and serve by 5pm on 21 July 2014 a joint skeleton argument, addressing common issues that are agreed between those parties, and (if so advised) any brief supplements to that document concerning issues specific to each party

AND UPON reading the Respondent's application of 16 July 2014 for permission to: (1) vary paragraphs 3(i) and 3(j) of the Directions Order; and (2) admit a second witness statement of Mr Rasmussen

AND UPON no objections having been made to the Respondent's application by Booking.com B.V., Expedia, Inc., or InterContinental Hotels Group Plc

IT IS ORDERED THAT:

- 1. Paragraph 3(i) of the Directions Order be varied to read as follows:
 - "By 10am on 21 July 2014, the Respondent to file and serve its skeleton argument"
- 2. Paragraph 3(j) of the Directions Order be varied to read as follows:
 - "By 10am on 22 July 2014, Booking.com B.V., Expedia, Inc., and InterContinental Hotels Group Plc to file and serve a joint skeleton argument, addressing common issues that are agreed between those parties, and (if so advised) any brief supplements to that document concerning issues specific to each party"
- 3. The Respondent be granted permission to admit a second witness statement of Mr Rasmussen, to be filed and served together with the Respondent's skeleton argument
