3 THE PRESIDENT: Mr Howe, good morning.

4 MR HOWE: Good morning, my Lord. Since the court and

5 Tribunal rose last Friday, the parties have been working

6 extremely hard and continuously in fact in agreeing

7 terms of settlement and I am happy to report that they

8 have now agreed terms of settlement. The documents have

9 either just been executed or were in the process of

10 being executed about five minutes ago.

11 My Lord, in those circumstances, subject to

12 your Lordship, what we were proposing to do was to

13 submit Tomlin orders, once they are properly drawn up

14 and signed, for the Tribunal and the court's approval.

15 The Tomlin orders are in typical form in that they refer

16 to the confidential settlement agreement but otherwise

17 have the standard provisions of Tomlin orders of

18 proceedings being stayed, et cetera.

19 My Lord, once again, I have to apologise for

20 reporting this so late and inconveniencing the Tribunal

21 and its members by bringing you all in, in order to hear

22 me simply say that we have now finally resolved the

23 matter.

24 My Lord, we are extremely grateful to the Tribunal

25 and your Lordship for the indulgence that you have shown

2 the parties and it has been extremely productive and has  
3 happily resulted in a resolution of all the proceedings.

4 THE PRESIDENT: Well, that clearly is worth the time that  
5 has been spent and we are, for our part, very grateful  
6 to the parties for their efforts. Courts always like to  
7 hear that matters have been settled because almost  
8 always these are outcomes that are better for the  
9 parties than a court-imposed result after a long  
10 hearing. So we extend our congratulations to the  
11 parties and we entirely understand why the time was  
12 needed.

13 So we will rise. I do not think there is any need  
14 for you to do anything other than submit the orders to  
15 the Tribunal in the usual way and we will make those  
16 orders on the papers. So, for myself and for my  
17 colleagues, we will merely thank the parties for their  
18 diligence and hard work in bringing these proceedings so  
19 efficiently to the court and in their good sense in  
20 concluding a negotiated agreement.

21 So unless there is anything that anyone else wants  
22 to say in addition to you, Mr Howe, we will rise and  
23 await the agreed Tomlin orders. Thank you all very  
24 much.
