CONSENT ORDER

UPON the Proposed Class Representative's pending application to serve the First and Second Proposed Defendants out of the jurisdiction (the **Service Out Application**)

AND UPON the service of the application for a Collective Proceedings order on the Third and Fourth Proposed Defendants (the **UK Apple Entities**) by the Proposed Class Representative on 9 September 2026

AND UPON the UK Apple Entities filing Acknowledgements of Service on 16 September 2026 indicating that they intend to challenge the jurisdiction of the Tribunal

AND UPON the deadline for the UK Apple Entities to file an application to contest jurisdiction being 30 September 2026 (the **Jurisdiction Challenge Deadline**)

AND UPON the Proposed Class Representative and the UK Apple Entities agreeing that the Jurisdiction Challenge Deadline shall be aligned as between all of the Proposed Defendants

AND UPON the UK Apple Entities having explicitly stated that they have not waived their rights to object to the Tribunal's exercise of its jurisdiction to hear the Proposed Class Representative's claim against them in these proceedings

BY CONSENT IT IS ORDERED THAT:

1. The Jurisdiction Challenge Deadline shall be extended until either:
 - a. The deadline for the First and Second Proposed Defendants to apply to contest jurisdiction (as extended, if applicable, by paragraph 2 below); or
 - b. 14 days from the date that the UK Apple Entities are notified by the Proposed Class Representative of the Tribunal's final decision to reject the Service Out Application in relation to the First and Second Proposed Defendants.
2. If the First and Second Proposed Defendants are not served simultaneously, the deadline to file and serve any application to contest the jurisdiction of the Tribunal for whichever Defendant is served first shall be extended to the deadline applying to the Defendant which is served second.
3. Costs in the case.
4. There be liberty to apply.
